Ray is a member of the Rotary Club of Sturt, in Alice Springs. He has been a Rotarian for over 30 years. Ray is on the committee and from one of the three Rotary Clubs in Alice Springs that organise the Henley on Todd which has been going for 52 years. Ray gave a very entertaining talk on the event. The event is series of "Boat" races, and Rotary runs a bar, and coordinates stalls. They have cannons that fire flour or water. There is a Viking boat with Vikings and Viqueens, and a square rigger with pirates and wenches. Competitors come from around the world. The clubs have been inducted into the International Fellowship of Yachting Rotarians (for a short time ©) Clubs and the Henley on Todd do a lot of promotional work for the Alice Springs Tourist Commission bringing enormous benefits to tourism. Rotary exchange students participate, and a Rotary District Conference in Alice Springs had the Henley on Todd as the theme. The boats have been to Melbourne and Perth.
