

Reykjavik is the world's most northernmost capital of a sovereign state, and is the largest city in Iceland. It is located in south western Iceland on the southern shore of Faxaflol Bay. With a population of around 120,000 it is the city of heart of Icelands economic and government activity. Reykjavik is believed to be the location of first settlement in Iceland, which Ingolfur Amarson is said to have established around the year 870. Until the 18th century there was little urban development in the city. The city developed into an official trading town in 1786 and it grew steadily over the next few decades. It transformed into a regional and later national centre of commerce, population and government activities.

The Rotary Club of Reykjavik was founded in 1935 and has 122 members, meets on Wednesdays at the Hotel Saga. The President is Gudfinna Bjarnaelir and the secretary is Magnus Gottfirdson.

> Guest Speaker - Brian Roy introduced Guest Speaker Joe Howard

Joe's brother Ben Howard's son Hamish was born in 2004 in need of urgent medical assistance. Hamish was taken to Sydney for surgery, and had 12 open heart surgery operations. Sadly he did not survive. Jarrod Maher his mate had a son born in 2010, he was flown to Sydney also for surgery. His loss highlighted the lack of support for fathers when an infant passes away, so Pillars of Strength was founded in Sydney. Around 44,000 babies each year need intensive care, and over 1000 are mortalities. Pillars of Strength are now available to support fathers, providing promotional information in wards. They provide tickets to sports events to help fathers in difficult times. Dads played at the SCG. Some dads do not talk about their experiences until they get to these events for time out and support. They have organized a golf day to raise funds for these efforts. Black Dog Institute and Beyond Blue are to be considered as partners in this support. Fathers can lose confidence and suffer from depression. They do provide in hospital support, counselling, and assist with the costs of accommodation and parking.
