

International Toast: JOHN RORRISON - Tonight's International Toast is to The Rotary Club of Luxembourg.

Luxembourg is officially the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg. It is a land locked country in Western Europe. It is bordered by Belgium, France and Germany and has a population of 525,000 people. As a Representative Democracy with a constitutional Monarch, it is headed by the world's only Grand Duke, and is the world's only remaining Grand Duchy. Luxembourg is a developed country with an advanced economy and the world's highest Gross Domestic Product per capita according to the World Bank. Reflecting its' geographic position, Luxembourg's culture is a fusion of Romance and Germanic Europe. Luxembourg is a trilingual country with Luxembourgish, French and German the official languages. Although a secular state Luxembourg is mainly Roman Catholic.

The Rotary Club of Luxemburg was formed in 1929, has 103 members and meets at 12.15 at the Cercle Munster. The President is Vic Fischback and the Secretary is Bim Biwer.
