

The Odd Body

How many taste buds are on my tongue?

According to Dr Thomas Greiner, the number of taste buds on the tongue is a tough one. He adds that it really depends on how big your tongue is. If you look closely, you will see that the tongue is covered with many small bumps (papillae). There are many different types of papillae, but there are 250 taste buds on average on each papilla. To find out how many taste buds you have, count your papillae and multiply by 250. By the way babies have more taste buds than adults. They have them on their cheeks as well as on their tongues.

What came first, traffic lights or the motorcar?

Traffic lights were used before the invention of the motorcar. In 1868 a lantern was used with red and green signals at a London intersection to control the flow of horse-pulled buggies and pedestrians. They were also used as railroad signals, which were adapted by adding an amber light to be used for cars. Officer William Potts introduced manually controlled electric traffic lights in Detroit, Michigan in 1920. The first automatic traffic lights were used in Cleveland, Ohio, after being invented later in 1920 by Garrett Morgan.
