CLUB ASSEMBLY

As this meeting was the first Club Assembly for 2011/2012, Club Service Projects Director Sue Honey chaired it and requested that each of the *Club Administration Committees* meet to discuss their roles within the Club and present two aims for the year to all the members.

As pictured, the members took this assignment seriously and each Chair reported back to the members with a summary of the Group's discussion. (The Assembly for Standing Committees will be held on August 25th).



CLUB BYLAW AMENDMENTS:

Sue also announced that there are some changes required to the Club's By-Laws: The Board proposes an amendment to the Club's By-laws to be voted upon at the ordinary meeting on Thursday 28 July (Article 16). Under this Article, members are to be provided 10 days notice of the amendment. The amendment will be passed if two thirds of the members present vote in the affirmative.

The Article under review is Article 6-Fees and Dues:

Section 1 - The admission fee shall be \$35.00 to be paid before the applicant can qualify as a member.

Section 2 - The membership dues shall be \$220.00 per annum (reviewed annually) and may be payable semi-annually on the first day of July and of January, with the understanding that a portion of each semi-annual payment shall be applied to each member's subscription to the RI official magazine.

The proposed amendment is:

Section 1 - An admission fee, an amount to be determined by the Board and reviewed annually, is to be paid before the applicant can qualify as a member. Section 2 - The annual membership dues shall be an amount determined by the Board and reviewed annually. Dues may be payable semi-annually on the first day of July and of January, with the understanding that a portion of each semi-annual payment shall be applied to each member's subscription to the RI official magazine.

Reason for the amendment:

This change allows the Board to make necessary revisions to the Fees and Dues without having to change the By-Laws on each occasion. This means that the Club's By-Laws maintain currency.
