
A FEW IMPORTANT THINGS:

CRAZY HATS FOR ROTARY HEALTH

All members were asked to wear a hat to our meeting tonight. As a result we had a fine collection of very interesting hats. Rhonda Sharkie was the fashion judge for the event. The winner was Gerry Page with his "Book Book Ad hat and runner-up was Phil Jackson for his hat which featured "feathers on a bald head." Raffles, which brought in about \$418 for Rotary Health, were won by The Galloways, the Duffus's, Laurie Fromholtz, Alok Sharma and Bryan Short.

SERGEANT AT ARMS: Allan Duffus raised a tidy sum for Rotary Health with his fine session. Along with those having birthdays and anniversaries, Allan fined all those not wearing a hat. He then went on to ask each table a general knowledge question such as "When were the ANZACs evacuated from Gallipoli. This proved to be a great revenue raiser as everyone at each table was fined one way or another. This was a fun, painless way in which to raise money for Rotary Health.

GUEST SPEAKER:

Our guest speaker, Denise Flockton, was introduced by Don Pembleton. In January of this year Denise joined a group of six Rotarians to travel to Nepal to take part in a project started by the Wahroonga Rotary Club to train the teachers there. Of the six team members four were from our district. Denise told us about her trip to the village, part of which was by four wheel drive and the last part by foot across a suspension bridge and then up a very steep slope. She also told us about the Opening Ceremony which lasted for three hours!

Denise and her group were housed in tents on a rice paddy field and they had the only "flushing toilet" in the area. Hot water was brought to them in a bucket by the guide so that they could shower. The children are very proud of their uniforms and wear them each day. At school they sit six to a very basic desk and the only resource is a concrete blackboard painted black.

Education is values-based, so all the children's books need to be value-based. All education must be delivered in English – however - the teachers' English is very poor so one of the group's tasks was to work out ways to improve the English skills of the teachers. Unfortunately the rural areas are missing out. The government only pays for one teacher per village. Many walked up to three hours a day to attend the training. Denise's group were able to give each teacher a resource pack and each school a set of dictionaries and atlases. Denise informed us that the future focus is on increasing the English skills of the teachers.

President Michelle thanked Denise for her very interesting presentation.
