Guest Speaker

Our guest speaker Lyn Butler, introduced by John Hawkins, has been in Wagga Wagga for 14 years, and has a Diploma of Orthoptics, and works with Vision Australia.

This organisation supports all vision impaired persons from babies to adults. There are an estimated 300,000 vision impaired persons in Australia, and this figure is set to double by 2020 as the population ages.

The budget runs to \$80m per annum, but the government only picks up about 30% of this. The rest is

by donation and fundraising. Another factor is the unemployment rate, with 64% of otherwise very able persons unable to get work.

As Pat Ingram indicated as he thanked Lyn, there is so much that Vision Australia does that we know little or nothing about.

We were given a definition of Legally Blind and shown some examples of the sort of vision experienced by persons with other conditions. Cataract

and Glaucoma are the more common conditions,

and we were urged to have a regular eye check up, at least every two years.

Vision Australia provides help in Independent Living, with mobility assistants, and technology to make life a little easier.

The Daisy Player is an example in point, as well as clocks with high contrast dials and a really neat gadget that tells when a cup is full, to help prevent scalding accidents.

The work of an Orthoptist with clients includes reading aides, such as Electronic Viewers and strong Magnifying Glasses. It also covers Lighting, and reducing glare by appropriate Sunglasses, along with little things such as the Signature Guide. A simple thing that must make life so much easier. This was a most interesting and informative talk, and we were reminded

again to avoid fats, eat fish, dark green vegetables, and have regular eye checks.
