He is staying with John Flynn and enjoyed a top lamb roast. We are the 82nd club he has visited.

Rob is passionate about polio. His bike is recumbent style which makes it easier and far more comfortable to ride.

He showed us photos taken by Jenny Horton who spends a great deal of time in India with Immunisation days. They are a stark reminder as to what happens if we don't do anything! A video also highlighted the mobility of the virus. Russia had an outbreak earlier this year, and Australia just missed by a whisker when a Pakistani tourist was detected carrying the disease, unbeknown to him.

Currently, \$800m contains Polio to 1000 cases world wide per year.


If we could spend just \$200m more, it could be eradicated by the end of this year. What does \$200m buy? One new fighter for the airforce!



We have a ARH scholarship running at the moment researching melanoma. It is named in honour of the late PPGordon Braid.


