

## **FEATURED SPEAKERS**



Our first speaker was new member **Craig Bromley.** 

Craig said he had his first experience on Sunday Market recently and he enjoyed it. He grew up in Gymea in Sydney's South and at the age of ten he moved with his family to Rabaul New Guinea.

For Craig New Guinea provided fertile ground for his imagination as Rabaul was littered with leftovers from the Japanese and allied occupation in World War 11. There were tunnels with booby traps,

old Japanese war planes left abandoned and lots of places and items for a boy to explore.

The family returned to the Sutherland Shire where Craig enjoyed surfing. He finished High School and commenced engineering at Uni. But dropped out and came to Wagga in 1980 for a job promotion and is still here. He worked for Paul Smithson in 1985 and bought him out in 1999 and then on sold the dealership to Scott Braid in 2010. He has been retired since then but gave the impression he is getting itchy feet and keen to get back into the workforce.

PP John Smith, a fellow flying enthusiast, has been nagging him to join Rotary for some time and after a few reds with Smithy and a few hangovers he finally agreed. His flying has taken him around Australia twice and he has had some wonderful experiences.
