CLUB ASSEMBLY - DIRECTORS REPORTS



Laurie reported on the status of our markets, and noted that more favourable weather is finally showing up as income from **Sunday Markets**, after a unfortunate start to the Rotary Year, with wet Sundays. Planning for the Christmas market is under way, and the committee will meet today to develop strategies for Christmas Market, Children's entertainment and advertising.

At the **Farmers Market**, one community organization will be permitted to sell tickets, or promote their cause. This month, Breast Cancer Awareness has been selected for the opportunity.

The **Food and Wine Festiva**l committee is now meeting fortnightly, and has set Saturday March 31, as the date for the 2012 event. Laurie reports that succession planning is underway to find a new chairman to follow Kevin Roben, after the 2012 event.

The Project committee have met 5 times, and considered 17 applications for assistance, recommending 6 requests, for a combined value of \$8030.



Jim Gibson reported on Rotary Foundation issues, making the point that The Foundation is the charitable arm of Rotary International, and is supported solely by voluntary contributions from Rotarians and Friends of The Foundation. **Group Study Exchange** is a Rotary Foundation program in which Wollundry has always been involved. District 9700 will host two inbound teams this year, one from Scotland, and one from Oklahoma USA, from 4 March, to 1st April 2012. Our Board offered to look after one of these groups in Wagga Wagga, and we got the Americans.

Our involvment in the **Centurion Club**, championed by PDG John Egan, runs to 15 members, and Foundation support of an extra US\$50 will qualify our members. **RAWCS** is an Australian initiative under the banner of FAIM. Jim advises that involvement is planned, but no specific project has been identified.



Andrew pointed out the good work being provided by Tony Weissel, but with an ulterior motive - he is effectively calling for a secretary for the club for next year.

Wollundry has heavy involvement in Youth activities through CSU scholarships and Noel Barnes Scholarships, each of which is a club initiative, and then we support the wider Rotary initiatives of RYLA, RYDA, RYPEN, MUNA, Science Forum and School Liasions.

Our involvement in Youth Exchange is the crown in this portfolio, and another year of participation reflects great credit on all involved

"All is Good" was the headline, and he thanked all the members that had contributed to the club manual update.
