

SUNFLOWER SEEDS FOR UKRAINE NEWS JULY 2022

INITIATIVE OF THE ROTARY CLUB OF COOLAMON D9705

July has been a very busy month for the Sunflower Seeds project. We have sent out plenty of seeds and now display/donation boxes. The 1,000 boxes arrived and are now being distributed to various clubs. Thanks go to PP Hank Doll from the Young RC for delivering many of these boxes to the Canberra Rotary clubs.

The distribution of seeds has almost completely depleted our stock and we are now going to Plan B to get seeds. We have found another way and that is to buy seeds from Woolworths who stock a sunflower seed for birds. These are in 1.5kg bags and will yield around 320 small packets of seeds. (Approx.. 40 seeds to a packet).

We will always be indebted to Doug Bruckner for his initial very generous donation of his seeds after harvest. The seeds from Woolies cost around \$5.50 per bag and it costs a lot more for us to send you seeds via AusPost.



We still have around 350 display/donation boxes on hand so let me know if you are still interested in getting some. We feel it is a great way to get donation from a passive or active display of the boxes with the packets of seeds inside.



All of you who have received seeds and now some of the boxes have asked me for invoices for the postage and for the seeds and boxes sent.

Our Coolamon Treasurer and I will prepare these invoices when Mary Potts gets back from the Larapinta Trek in Central Australia. Mary along with two other Coolamon Rotarians and one non-Rotarian are currently on the Larapinta Trek raising funds for ShelterBox.

So my apologies for not doing this sooner I have personally been extremely busy with work.



