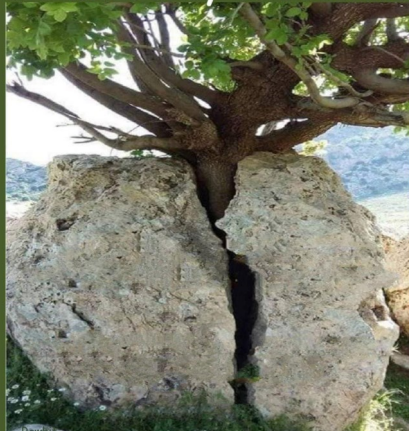

Proudly supported by Rotary Worldwide</p>	<p>Thank you for your donation!</p> <p>Best Soil for Growing</p> <p>Sunflowers are annuals that grow well in fertile, well-drained soil. Their ideal soil conditions lie between a pH level of 6.0 and 7.5, however, they're pretty hardy so will grow in most soils with some care. Most importantly, they love being planted in a spot that has 6-8 hours of sunlight each day. You could even grow sunflowers indoors in containers if you place them near a north facing window.</p> <p>When and How to Plant</p> <p>Spring or early summer, when the soil is starting to warm up, is the best time to sow sunflower seeds. A typical flowering time is about 8-10 weeks. If you're sowing seeds in a garden bed, you should aim to place them about 60cm apart and 2cm deep.
